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## DISCHARGE INSTRUCTIONS FOR NASAL SURGERY

- 1. Bleeding is quite common after surgery and will slowly diminish over 4 to 7 days. If excessive, call the office immediately.
- 2. Swelling of the outer nose is usually minimal unless a rhinoplasty ("breaking" of the outer nose) was performed.
- 3. Expect the nose to be blocked during the first week after surgery. This is due to blood, mucous, and swelling inside of the nose.
- 4. Head elevation is important for 7 days after surgery. Do not apply ice unless your physician instructs you to do so.
- 5. Medications will be prescribed on an individual basis.
- 6. After surgery your physician will tell you when to come to the office for a follow-up visit. Internal packing, splints, or a cast will be removed at that time.
- 7. Aspirin and Ibuprofen should be avoided as they can cause increased bleeding.
- 8. Activities that increase blood pressure or pulse should be avoided for 2 to 3 weeks as they may cause excessive bleeding.
- 9. Activity should be limited for the first week and gradually increased to normal activity over the second and third weeks under the direction of your physician.
- 10. Blowing the nose should be avoided until the first post-op visit.
